
San Angelo Neighborhoods— At a Glance

The Fort Concho Neighborhood is located directly south of the Concho River and downtown area. Major thoroughfares include Oakes Street, Chadbourne Street and portions of South Bryant Boulevard, which runs through established blocks within the neighborhood. Much of the area is historic in nature. Historic Fort Concho is a nationally recognized Historic Landmark, originally in 1867 to protect the early settlers from threats in the area. Soldiers were also tasked to map the West Texas Region. The neighborhood is also home to the San Angelo Museum of Fine Arts and the Railway Museum of San Angelo. Fort Concho Elementary is situated directly south of the historic site and serves students in the area.


MONTHLY RENTAL vs MORTGAGE RATES
